In 2001, Dr. Sackett was made an Officer of the Order of Canada and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada. In 2000, Dr. Sackett was inducted into the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame. He was awarded the Gairdner Foundation Wightman Award in 2009.
